12	WHEREAS, employing two elected officials in the same month can cause confusion and
13	disagreement regarding compensation and benefits to each official; and
14	WHEREAS, employing the newly elected official on January 1 would simplify the payroll process
15	save local governments and taxpayers money, and make it easier for all concerned to remember the officia
16	transition date.

18	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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20	Section 1. Section 7-4-2205, MCA, is amended to read:
21	"7-4-2205. Term of office oath. (1) Persons Each person elected to the different offices are
22	office named in 7-4-2203 shall hold holds their respective offices the office for the term of 4 years and until
23	their successor is elected and qualified.
24	(2) Persons A person appointed to any of the different offices serve serves at the pleasure of the
25	commissioners.
26	(3) The officers Each officer who is mentioned in this part and who is elected to office must shall
27	(a) prior to January 1 following the election, make a written oath of office if the officer has no
28	previously made a written oath for the term elected;
29	(b) take office on the first Monday day of January succeeding their the election; and
30	(c) take the oral oath of office as soon as possible after January 1 succeeding the election." -END-
