ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. There are currently eleven members on the Committee on Montana Telecommunications Access Services for the Disabled. This bill would increase that committee to twelve members.
- 2. The committee meets six times each year, with four of those being regular meetings and two being working committee meetings.
- 3 Members are paid honorariums of \$50 per day (\$50 x 6 meetings = \$300).
- 4. Members from outside the Helena area average \$100 in per diem per meeting (\$100 x 6 meetings = \$600).
- 5. Funding is provided through the earmarked TDD account.

Telecommunications is the primary vehicle of commerce and industry, the means to convey 7 and receive information and knowledge, and the way we connect with others on a personal as well as 8 business level. Telecommunications gives people independence and self-sufficiency, and it provides goods 9 and services, human contact, and fellowship.
