## STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

#### Fiscal Note for HB0298, as introduced

#### DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act providing for the 2-year terms for members of the Health Care Advisory Council, providing that a member may serve three terms, and extending the termination of Health Care Advisory Council (HCAC) to the year 2001.

## ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The HCAC is administratively attached to the Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS).
- 2. There are ten members on the advisory council.
- 3. The HCAC will meet ten times per year. Each meeting costs \$150 per member per meeting (for travel, per diem, and associated costs) for a total of \$1,500 per meeting and \$15,000 annually. (10 x 10 X \$150 = \$15,000).
- 4. Consulting costs needed for operations are \$25,000 each year for the purpose of: monitoring past legislation; managed care quality, cost, and access evaluation; uniform data development activities; and measuring the impact of integrated health care on rural health.
- 5. DPHHS provides staff support to the HCAC. This support staff is 0.5 FTE entry level grade 16 (with 17% added for benefits), \$17,320, and 0.5 FTE entry level grade 9 (with 17% added for benefits), \$9,632, for a total personal services cost of \$26,952 each year of the biennium.
- 6. This support staff would require \$2,500 in travel costs each year.
- 7. Funding for the HCAC will be provided within the departments cost allocation plan.
- 8. The HCAC was included in the executive budget as a new proposal. At this point in appropriations subcommittee action, it is not funded.
