18	(c) order the removal of vehicles parked in violation of motor vehicle regulations of each unit at the

Fiscal Note for HB0342, as introducted

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION: An act eliminating the \$10 per offense maximum fine limit that the Board of Regents may allow the President of each University Unit to access for an on-campus motor vehicle or parking violation; and amending section 20-25-312,MCA.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The objective of the Montana University System (MUS) would not be to enhance revenue, but to reduce the number of parking infractions that which occur on the campuses. The MUS may increase the cost of fines for certain infractions so that fewer people violate regulations. As a result, fewer tickets would be issued, and revenue will remain the same.

FISCAL IMPACT: There is no fiscal impact.
