8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

10	Section 1. Section 2-15-3006, MCA, is amended to read:
11	"2-15-3006. Montana mint committee composition allocation. (1) There is a Montana mint
12	committee composed of five six members. The members include the director of the department of
13	agriculture and four five members appointed by the governor.
14	(2) Each of the four five appointed members must be a citizen of Montana who is actively involved
15	in the growing of mint in this state, and one of the appointed members must be a member of or otherwise
16	represent the mint industry research council. The qualifications of members must continue during their
17	terms of office.
18	(3) A list of nominees for appointment must be submitted to the governor by Montana associations
19	representing mint growers. Names of nominees must be submitted at least 91 days before the expiration
20	of a committee member's term. The governor shall appoint members from among the persons nominated.
21	(4) Appointed members shall serve staggered terms of 3 years. Initial appointment must be as
22	follows:
23	(a) one member for a 1-year term;
24	(b) two members for 2-year terms; and
25	(c) one member <u>two members</u> for a 3-year term.
26	(5) The committee is allocated to the department of agriculture for administrative purposes only
27	as prescribed in 2-15-121."

Fiscal Note for HB0392, as introduced

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act increasing the number of persons who serve on the Montana Mint Committee; requiring that one member represent the Mint Industry Research Council.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. One member would be added to the Montana Mint Committee.

- Four regular one-day meetings per year, plus one three-day meeting to attend the Mint Industry Research Council (MIRC) meeting out-of-state, would be held each year. Increased expenses for in-state travel would be \$76 and out-of-state travel would be \$1,160.
- 3. Members receive \$25 per diem (compensation provided by law) each day for an increase of \$175.
- 4. Current program revenues are sufficient to support the increased costs.
