17	Except as provided in subsection (2), the THE following information must be provided by any pet shop
18	operator, who OR HUMANE SOCIETY, OR PUBLICLY OPERATED ANIMAL SHELTER OR POUND THAT
19	makes a cat or dog available for sale <u>OR ADOPTION</u> :
20	(a)(1)(A) age, sex, and weight of the animal;
21	(b)(2)(B) breed of the animal;
22	(e)(3)(C) a record of vaccinations and veterinary care and treatment the animal has received,
23	INCLUDING, IF AVAILABLE, THE MANUFACTURER'S NAME AND THE SERIAL NUMBER OF THE
24	VACCINATION USED; AND
25	$\frac{d}{d}$ a record of surgical sterilization of the animal or notice of the lack of surgical sterilization,
26	as applicable;
27	(2) THE FOLLOWING INFORMATION MUST BE RETAINED FOR A PERIOD OF 2 YEARS AND
28	REMAINS CONFIDENTIAL UNLESS REQUESTED PURSUANT TO AN ENFORCEMENT ACTION OR LEGAL
29	PROCEEDING:
30	(e)(5)(A) IF KNOWN, THE name and address of the breeder of the animal; and



ı	(1)(b)(B) IF KNOWN, THE name and address of any person who owned of harbored the animal
2	between its birth and the time of sale OR ADOPTION-; AND
3	(7)(C) A COPY OF THE IMPORT PERMIT AND HEALTH CERTIFICATE PERTAINING TO AN ANIMAL
4	IMPORTED FROM OUTSIDE MONTANA.
5	(2) Subsection (1) does not apply to a cat or dog offered for sale by a humane society or publicly
6	operated animal pound or shelter.
7	
8	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Adoption of cat or dog from animal shelter or humane society, ANIMAL
9	SHELTER, OR POUND spay or neuter required deposit penalty EXCEPTIONS. (1) Except as provided
10	in subsections (6) and (7), a humane society or <u>PUBLICLY OPERATED</u> animal shelter or pound may not offer
11	for adoption, sale, or trade any cat or dog that has not been redeemed by the owner unless:
12	(a) the animal has been spayed or neutered; or
13	(b) the person to whom the animal is released agrees in writing to have the animal spayed or
14	neutered and a deposit for spaying or neutering the animal has been paid. The deposit must be in an
15	amount determined by the humane society, OR PUBLICLY OPERATED animal shelter, or pound to be
16	comparable to the lowest fee for spaying or neutering that is charged by veterinarians in the locale.
17	(2) Upon payment of the deposit required in subsection (1), the person who is adopting the animal
18	must receive a certificate for spaying or neutering, to be presented to a licensed veterinarian, who shall
19	complete the certificate when the spaying or neutering is done. Upon receipt of the completed certificate
20	verifying that the animal has been spayed or neutered, the humane society, OR PUBLICLY OPERATED
21	animal shelter, or pound shall forward the deposit to the veterinarian who performed the procedure.
22	(3) The deposit must be forfeited if the spaying or neutering is not done:
23	(a) within 30 days if the cat or dog is more than 6 months old at the time of adoption; or
24	(b) by the time the animal reaches the age of 6 months if the animal is less than 6 months old at
25	the time of adoption, or within 30 days of the adoption, whichever is longer.
26	(4) A deposit forfeited pursuant to subsection (3) may be used only for the following purposes:
27	(a) a public education program designed to prevent the overpopulation of cats and dogs;
28	(b) a program to spay or neuter cats and dogs; and
29	(c) costs incurred in the enforcement of this section, including a follow-up program to ensure that
30	animals adopted, FROM OR sold, or traded by the humane society, OR PUBLICLY OPERATED animal

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1	sneiter, or pound are spayed or neutered.
2	(5) Failure to fulfill the terms of an agreement entered into pursuant to subsection (1)(b) may, result
3	in:
4	(a) seizure and reimpoundment of the animal by the humane society, OR PUBLICLY OPERATED
5	animal shelter, or pound; and
6	(b) at the discretion of the county attorney, RESULT IN THE filing of a misdemeanor charge
7	punishable by a fine of not more than \$500.
8	(6) The provisions of this section do not apply to an animal for which a licensed veterinarian verifies
9	in writing that spaying or neutering would be injurious to the animal's health.
10	(7) The provisions of this section do not apply to an animal adopted for breading purposes if the
11	person adopting-the animal pays an additional adoption fee of at least \$100.
12	(7) THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION DO NOT APPLY WHEN A HUMANE SOCIETY OR
13	PUBLICLY OPERATED ANIMAL SHELTER OR POUND, AT ITS DISCRETION, CHOOSES TO ACCEPT AN
14	ADOPTION FEE OF NOT LESS THAN \$50 FROM A PERSON WHO WISHES TO ADOPT AN ANIMAL FOR
15	BREEDING PURPOSES.
16	
17	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Additional spaying or neutering requirements not precluded
18	cooperative agreements. (1) Humane societies, AND PUBLICLY OPERATED animal shelters, and public
19	animal pounds may enter into cooperative agreements with each other and with licensed veterinarians in
20	carrying out the provisions of [section 2].
21	(2) [Section 2] does not preclude humane societies, AND PUBLICLY OPERATED animal shelters,
22	and public animal pounds from engaging in activities set forth in their charters as long as the activities are
23	not inconsistent with [section 2].
24	(3) Humane societies, AND PUBLICLY OPERATED animal shelters, and public animal pounds may
25	establish spaying and neutering requirements in addition to the requirements set out in [section 2], such
26	as:
27	(a) shorter timeframes for compliance with spaying and neutering requirements;
28	(b) arranging an appointment for spaying or neutering with a licensed veterinarian; and
29	(c) delivering the animal to a licensed veterinarian for surgery prior to releasing the animal to the
30	adopting person.



1	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Codification instruction. [Sections 1 through 3] are intended to be
2	codified as an integral part of Title 7, chapter 23, and the provisions of Title 7, chapter 23, apply to
3	[sections 1 through 3].
4	
5	NEW SECTION. SECTION 5. APPLICABILITY. [THIS ACT] APPLIES ONLY IF A LOCAL
6	GOVERNMENT HAS NOT ENACTED AN ORDINANCE THAT CONFLICTS WITH THE PROVISIONS OF [THIS
7	ACT].
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
