STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

Fiscal Note for HB0481, as introduced

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

An act generally revising the laws relating to motor vehicle license plates; authorizing the issuance of capitol restoration license plates; allowing a foreign-made vehicle to display original license plates.

ASSUMPTIONS:

Department of Corrections:

- 1. New Section 1 of HB 481 establishes procedures for capitol restoration license plates similar to current procedures for regular issue license plates. On capitol restoration license plates the county number must be replaced by a non-removable design or decal designating capitol restoration.
- 2. The license plate operation general fund appropriation would assume any costs not borne by the Department of Justice Motor Vehicle Division for the capitol restoration license plates involved with this bill. The non-removable design or decal designating capitol restoration could be silk-screened on the existing plate at the Montana Correctional Enterprises (MCE) license plate operation. If a selfadhesive decal is used by the Department of Justice and issued at the time of license application, then the Department of Justice would assume the associated costs.
- 3. Existing plate design would be used with the county number replaced by a nonremovable design or decal designating capitol restoration. Therefore, special license plates (such as collegiate plates) would not be necessary.
- 4. The MCE license plate operation would have no involvement with the foreign-made original license plates in Section 4 and as such no costs involved.
- 5. The existing license plate facility and MCE operations have the capability to produce these plates.

Department of Justice:

Capitol restoration license plates:

6. It is assumed that 750 capitol restoration license plates would be purchased during fiscal 1998 and renewed during fiscal 1999 and 250 additional "new" capitol restoration license plates would be purchased during fiscal 1999. Total capitol restoration license plate fees are estimated at \$15,000 in fiscal 1998 and \$20,000 in fiscal 1999.

The special state capitol restoration license plate fee is \$20. Upon the original application for the special license plate, the county treasurer would deposit \$3 of the plate fee in the county general fund, \$2 in the state general fund, and the balance in the capitol restoration state special revenue account.

The capitol restoration account will receive "donations" of approximately \$11,250 in fiscal 1998 (750 x \$15) and \$18,750 in fiscal 1999 ((250 x \$15) + (750 x \$20)). The county general fund would receive approximately \$2,250 in fiscal 1998 (750 x \$3) and \$750 in fiscal 1999 (250 x \$3). The state general fund would receive approximately \$1,500 in fiscal 1998 (750 x \$2) and \$500 in fiscal 1999 (250 x \$2).

The Department of Justice, Motor Vehicle Division, estimates that 200 of these "new" license plates issued in fiscal 1998 would be personalized and would be renewed in fiscal 1999. Also, 50 of the 250 "new" plates issued in fiscal 1999 would be personalized plates. Therefore, the state general fund would receive approximately $$4,000 (200 \times $20)$ in fiscal 1998 and $$1,000 (50 \times $20)$ in fiscal 1999 for these new personalized plates and $$1,000 (200 \times $5)$ in fiscal 1999 for renewals of these personalized plates.

- 7. Operating expenses in fiscal 1998 are estimated at \$500 for contracted services to design this issue of license plates and \$500 for printing and shipping of decals. In addition, the Department of Justice, Motor Vehicle Division, estimates that approximately 80 hours of programming will be required in the personalized plate system and 120 hours of programming in the registration system at a cost of approximately \$3,975 to implement the changes necessary in the motor vehicle system required by this bill. Operating expenses in fiscal 1999 are estimated at \$175 for printing and shipping of decals. Operating expenses for the Motor Vehicle Division related to the capitol restoration license plates are projected at \$4,975 in fiscal 1998 and \$175 in fiscal 1999.
- 8. The Department of Justice, Motor Vehicle Division, projects that this issue of license plates would be available to the public effective January 1, 1998, due to the time required to design this new issue of license plate and to coordinate with the MCE License Plate operation and the private vendor the production of the materials used to manufacture the license plates.

Foreign license plates on collector's item vehicle:

- 9. Implementation of Section 4 of this bill would increase the Department of Justice's operating expenses by approximately \$2,800 in fiscal 1998 for 140 hours of programming necessary to modify the motor vehicle computer system, registration and personalized plates subsystems including tracking the foreign plates and ensuring that law enforcement is able to obtain the necessary information on the foreign plates.
- 10. In calendar 1996 the Department of Justice registered 407 pioneer vehicles, 119 vintage vehicles, 24 vintage motorcycles, and 4 vintage snowmobiles. The number of those vehicles that were foreign motor vehicles manufactured more than 30 years ago is unknown.

FISCAL. IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact anticipated as the license plate operations general fund contained in the Governor's Executive Budget would be sufficient to cover any costs associated with HB 481.

1 vehicles of the motorcycle or quadricycle type, one for trailers, one for trucks, one for dealers in vehicles 2 of the motorcycle or quadricycle type that bear the distinctive letters "MCD" or the letters "MC" and the word "DEALER", one for franchised dealers in new motorcars (including trucks and trailers) or new and 3 4 used motorcars (including trucks and trailers) that bear the distinctive letter "D" or the word "DEALER", one for dealers in used motorcars only (including used trucks and trailers) that bear the distinctive letters 5 6 "UD" or the letter "U" and the word "DEALER", one for dealers in trailers and/or semitrailers (new or used) 7 that bear the distinctive letters "DTR" or the letters "TR" and the word "DEALER", one for dealers in recreational vehicles that bear the distinctive letters "RV" or the letter "R" and the word "DEALER", and 8 9 one for special license plates. All markings for the various kinds of dealers' plates must be placed on the 10 number plates assigned to the dealer, in the position that the department designates.

(2) All number plates for motor vehicles must be issued for a minimum period of 4 years, bear a
 distinctive marking, and be furnished by the state. In years when number plates are not issued, the
 department shall provide nonremovable stickers bearing appropriate registration numbers that must be
 affixed to the license plates in use.

(3) Subject to the provisions of this section, the department shall create a new design for number
plates as provided in this section.

17 (4) In the case of motorcars and trucks, plates must be of metal 6 inches wide and 12 inches in
18 length. The outline of the state of Montana must be used as a distinctive border on the license plates, and
19 the word "Montana" and the year must be placed across the plates. Registration plates must be treated
20 with a reflectorized background material according to specifications prescribed by the department.

21 (5) The distinctive registration numbers must begin with a number one or with a letter-number 22 combination, such as "A 1" or "AA 1", or any other similar combination of letters and numbers. The Except 23 as provided in [section 1], the distinctive registration number or letter-number combination assigned to the 24 vehicle must appear on the plate preceded by the number of the county and appearing in horizontal order 25 on the same horizontal baseline. The county number must be separated from the distinctive registration number by a separation mark unless a letter-number combination is used. The dimensions of the numerals 26 27 and letters must be determined by the department, and all county and registration numbers must be of 28 equal height.

(6) For the use of tax-exempt motor vehicles, in addition to the markings provided in this section,
 number plates must bear the following distinctive markings:

1 (a) For vehicles owned by the state, the department may designate the prefix number for the 2 various state departments. All numbered plates issued to state departments must bear the words "State 3 Owned", and a year number may not be indicated on the plates because these numbered plates are of a 4 permanent nature and will be replaced by the department only when the physical condition of numbered 5 plates requires it.

6 (b) For vehicles that are owned by the counties, municipalities, and special districts, as defined in 7 18-8-202, organized under the laws of Montana and not operating for profit, and that are used and 8 operated by officials and employees in the line of duty and for vehicles on loan from the United States government or the state of Montana to, or owned by, the civil air patrol and used and operated by officials 9 10 and employees in the line of duty, there must be placed on the number plates assigned, in a position that the department may designate, the letter "X" or the word "EXEMPT". Distinctive registration numbers for 11 12 plates assigned to motor vehicles of each of the counties in the state and those of the municipalities and special districts that obtain plates within each county must begin with number one and be numbered 13 14 consecutively. Because these number plates are of a permanent nature, they are subject to replacement by the department only when the physical condition of the number plates requires it and a year number may 15 16 not be displayed on the number plates.

(7) On all number plates assigned to motor vehicles of the truck and trailer type, other than
tax-exempt trucks and tax-exempt trailers, there must appear the letter "T" or the word "TRUCK" on plates
assigned to trucks and the letters "TR" or the word "TRAILER" on plates assigned to trailers and
housetrailers. The letters "MC" or the word "CYCLE" must appear on plates assigned to vehicles of the
motorcycle or quadricycle type.

(8) Number plates issued to a passenger car, truck, trailer, or vehicle of the motorcycle or
 quadricycle type may be transferred only to a replacement passenger car, truck, trailer, or motorcycle- or
 quadricycle-type vehicle. A registration or license fee may not be assessed upon a transfer of a number
 plate under 61-3-317 and 61-3-335.

(9) For the purpose of this chapter, the several counties of the state are assigned numbers as
follows: Silver Bow, 1; Cascade, 2; Yellowstone, 3; Missoula, 4; Lewis and Clark, 5; Gallatin, 6; Flathead,
7; Fergus, 8; Powder River, 9; Carbon, 10; Phillips, 11; Hill, 12; Ravalli, 13; Custer, 14; Lake, 15; Dawson,
16; Roosevelt, 17; Beaverhead, 18; Chouteau, 19; Valley, 20; Toole, 21; Big Horn, 22; Musselshell, 23;
Blaine, 24; Madison, 25; Pondera, 26; Richland, 27; Powell, 28; Rosebud, 29; Deer Lodge, 30; Teton, 31;



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Stillwater, 32; Treasure, 33; Sheridan, 34; Sanders, 35; Judith Basin, 36; Daniels, 37; Glacier, 38; Fallon,
 39; Sweet Grass, 40; McCone, 41; Carter, 42; Broadwater, 43; Wheatland, 44; Prairie, 45; Granite, 46;

 54; Petroleum, 55; Lincoln, 56. Any new counties must be assigned numbers by the department as they
 may be formed, beginning with the number 57.

6 (10) Each type of special license plate approved by the legislature, except collegiate license plates 7 authorized in 61-3-463, must be a separate series of plates, numbered as provided in subsection (5), except 8 that the county number must be replaced by a nonremovable design or decal designating the group or 9 organization to which the applicant belongs. Unless otherwise specifically stated in this section, the special 10 plates are subject to the same rules and laws as govern the issuance of regular license plates, must be 11 placed or mounted on a vehicle owned by the person who is eligible to receive them, and must be removed 12 upon sale or other disposition of the vehicle. The special license plates must be issued to national guard 13 members, former prisoners of war, handicapped persons, reservists, disabled veterans, survivors of the 14 Pearl Harbor attack, veterans of the armed services, or veterans of the armed services who were awarded 15 the purple heart medal, who comply with the following provisions:

(a) An active member of the Montana national guard may be issued special license plates with a
design or decal displaying the letters "NG". The adjutant general shall issue to each active member of the
Montana national guard a certificate authorizing the department to issue national guard plates, numbered
in sets of two with a different number on each set, and the member shall surrender the plates to the
department upon becoming ineligible to use them.

(b) An active member of the reserve armed forces of the United States of America who is a resident of this state may be issued special license plates with a design or decal displaying the following: United States army reserve, AR (symbol); United States naval reserve, NR (anchor); United States air force reserve, AFR (symbol); and United States marine corps reserve, MCR (globe and anchor). The commanding officer of each armed forces reserve unit shall issue to each eligible member of the reserve unit a certificate authorizing the issuance of special license plates, numbered in sets of two with a different number on each set. The member shall surrender the plates to the department upon becoming ineligible to use them.

(c) (i) A resident of Montana who is a veteran of the armed forces of the United States and who
 is 100% disabled because of an injury that has been determined by the department of veterans affairs to
 be service-connected may, upon presentation to the department of proof of the 100% disability, be issued:



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(A) a special license plate under this section with a design or decal displaying the letters "DV"; or
 (B) one set of any other military-related plates that the disabled veteran is eligible to receive under
 this section.

4 (ii) The fee for original or renewal registration by a 100% disabled veteran for a passenger vehicle. 5 or a truck with a GVW-rated capacity of 1 ton or less is \$5 and is in lieu of all other fees and taxes for that 6 vehicle under this chapter.

7

(iii) Special license plates issued to a disabled veteran are not transferable to another person.

8 (iv) A disabled veteran is not entitled to a special disabled veteran's license plate for more than one
9 vehicle.

(v) A vehicle lawfully displaying a disabled veteran's plate and that is conveying a 100% disabled
 veteran is entitled to the parking privileges allowed a handicapped person's vehicle under this title.

12 (d) A Montana resident who is a veteran of the armed forces of the United States and was 13 captured and held prisoner by a military force of a foreign nation, documented by the veteran's service 14 record, may upon application and presentation of proof be issued special license plates, numbered in sets 15 of two with a different number on each set, with a design or decal displaying the words "ex-prisoner of 16 war" or an abbreviation the department considers appropriate.

17 (e) Except as provided in subsection (10)(c), upon payment of all taxes and fees required by parts 18 3 and 5 of this chapter and upon furnishing proof satisfactory to the department that the applicant meets 19 the requirements of this subsection (e), the department shall issue to a Montana resident who is a veteran 20 of the armed services of the United States special license plates, numbered in sets of two with a different 21 number on each set, designed to indicate that the applicant is a survivor of the Pearl Harbor attack if the 22 applicant was a member of the United States armed forces on December 7, 1941, was on station on 23 December 7, 1941, during the hours of 7:55 a.m. to 9:45 a.m. (Hawaii time) at Pearl Harbor, the island 24 of Oahu, or offshore at a distance of not more than 3 miles, and received an honorable discharge from the 25 United States armed forces. If special license plates issued under this subsection are lost, stolen, or 26 mutilated, the recipient of the plates is entitled to replacement plates upon request and without charge.

(f) A motor vehicle owner and resident of this state who is a veteran or the surviving spouse of
a veteran of the armed services of the United States may be issued license plates inscribed as provided in
subsection (10)(f)(i) if the veteran was separated from the armed services under other than dishonorable
circumstances or was awarded the purple heart medal:



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(i) Upon submission of a department of defense form 214(DD-214) or its successor or documents
 showing an other-than-dishonorable discharge or a reenlistment, proper identification, and other relevant
 documents to show an applicant's qualification under this subsection, there must be issued to the applicant,
 in lieu of the regular license plates prescribed by law, special license plates numbered in sets of two with
 a different number on each set. The plates must display:

(A) the word "VETERAN" and a symbol signifying the United States army, United States navy,
United States air force, United States marine corps, or United States coast guard, according to the record
of service verified in the application; or

(B) a symbol representing the purple heart medal.

(ii) Plates must be furnished by the department to the county treasurer, who shall issue them to a
qualified veteran or to the veteran's surviving spouse. The plates must be placed or mounted on the vehicle
owned by the veteran or the veteran's surviving spouse designated in the application and must be removed
upon sale or other disposition of the vehicle.

(iii) Except as provided in subsection (10)(c), a veteran or surviving spouse who receives special
license plates under this subsection (10)(f) is liable for payment of all taxes and fees required under parts
3 and 4 of this chapter and a special veteran's or purple heart medal license plate fee of \$10. Upon an
original application for a license under this subsection (10)(f), the county treasurer shall:

18 (A) deposit \$3 of the special fee in the county general fund;

(B) remit \$1 for deposit in the state general fund; and

20 (C) deposit the remainder of the special fee in the state special revenue account established in

21 10-2-603 for administration, construction, operation, and maintenance of the state veterans' cemetery.

(iv) Upon subsequent annual renewal of registration, the county treasurer shall deposit all of the
 special fee as provided in subsection (10)(f)(iii)(C).

(g) A Montana resident who is eligible to receive a special parking permit under 49-4-301 may,
 upon written application on a form prescribed by the department, be issued a special license plate with a

26 design or decal bearing a representation of a wheelchair as the symbol of the handicapped person."

7 "61-3-412. Display of original Montana or foreign license plates on collector's item vehicle --8 definition -- validation. (1) (a) As used in this section, "original Montana license plate" means a license plate issued according to the provisions of 61-3-331; section 53-116, R.C.M. 1947; section 1759.1, R.C.M. 9 10 1935; or section 1759, R.C.M. 1921; whichever section was effective during the year of the manufacture of the motor vehicle on which the license plate is authorized to be displayed. 11

12 (b) As used in this section, "original foreign license plate" means an original license plate or the

replica of an original license plate issued by a country outside of the United States for a foreign motor 13

vehicle manufactured more than 30 years ago. The license plate must have English letters and numbers 14

15 with a maximum of nine characters that may not conflict with any current license plate series issued by the

16 department.

17 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of 61-3-332, the department shall authorize the owner of a motor vehicle registered as provided in 61-3-411 to display original Montana license plates or original 18 foreign license plates, with validation as required in subsection (3), after: 19

(a) payment of the fee required in subsection (5);
