Fiscal Note for HB0580, as introduced

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A bill requiring agency program budgets to contain a plan to reduce base budgets by 15 percent.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Agencies of all branches of government would be required to submit the information required by the proposal in addition to their normal budget request. Special forms would be developed for agency use, but none of the information would be captured in the budget system in its anticipated design.
- 2. The agency responses would be printed in a supplemental volume in the budget book series and absorbed within the publication budget approved by the appropriation subcommittee.
- 3. The executive budget development process would continue as usual and reflect Governor's recommendations.

FISCAL IMPACT: Absorbed within the publication budget approved by the subcommittee.
