Fiscal Note for <u>HB0610, as introduced</u>

DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:

A bill establishing a legislative committee to study the revenue and expenditures of the highways state special revenue account and Montana's transportation infrastructure needs; providing for appointments to the committee; appropriating funds for the operation of the committee; and providing an effective date and a termination date.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The Department of Transportation will use existing resources to provide support staff and technical advisors to assist the committee.
- 2. The appropriation is given to the Legislative Fiscal Division in the amount of \$15,000.
- There is no fiscal impact to Departments of Public Health and Human Services, Justice, Commerce, Agriculture, Fish, Wildlife, and Parks, or the Governor's Office.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is a decrease of \$15,000 in fiscal year 1998 in the highways state special revenue account for the appropriation to the Legislative Fiscal Division.

TECHNICAL NOTES:

Since it appears that the study will overlap two fiscal years, the appropriation should be designated as biennial.

Section 4 (4) page 3, line 14 of the introduced bill, reference is made to the "legislative fiscal committee" but should read "legislative finance committee".
