5	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT AUTHORIZING THE BOARD OF REGENTS OF HIGHER
6	EDUCATION TO WAIVE TUITION AND FEES FOR THE SPOUSE OR CHILDREN OF A MONTANA NATIONAL
7	GUARD MEMBER WHO WAS KILLED IN ACTION OR DIED AS A RESULT OF INJURY, DISEASE, OR OTHER
8	DISABILITY INCURRED WHILE SERVING ON STATE ACTIVE DUTY; AMENDING SECTION 20-25-421,
9	MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."
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11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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13	Section 1. Section 20-25-421, MCA, is amended to read:
14	"20-25-421. Charges for tuition waivers. The regents may:
15	(1) prescribe tuition rates, matriculation charges, and incidental fees for students in institutions
16	under their jurisdiction;
17	(2) waive nonresident tuition for selected and approved nonresident students, not to exceed at any
18	unit 2% of the full-time equivalent enrollment at that unit during the preceding year; except that however,
19	when necessary, tuition may be waived in excess of 2% of unit enrollment for nonresident students who
20	enroll under provisions of any WICHE-sponsored state reciprocal agreements which that provide for the
21	payment, where when required, of the student support fee by the reciprocal state;
22	(3) waive resident tuition for students at least 62 years of age;
23	(4) waive tuition and fees for:
24	(a) persons of one-fourth Indian blood or more who have been bona fide residents of Montana for
25	at least 1 year prior to enrollment in the Montana university system;
26	(b) persons designated by the department of corrections pursuant to 52-5-112;
27	(c) residents of Montana who served with the armed forces of the United States in any of its wars
28	and who were honorably discharged from military service;
29	(d) children of residents of Montana who served with the armed forces of the United States in any
30	of its wars and who were killed in action or died as a result of injury, disease, or other disability incurred



1	while in the service of the armed forces of the United States; or
2	(e) the spouses or children of residents of Montana who have been declared to be prisoners of war
3	or missing in action; <u>or</u>
4	(f) the spouse or children of a Montana national guard member who was killed in action or died as
5	a result of injury, disease, or other disability incurred while serving on state active duty;
6	(5) waive tuition charges for qualified survivors of Montana firefighters or peace officers killed in
7	the course and scope of employment. For purposes of this subsection, a qualified survivor is a person who
8	meets the entrance requirements at the state university or college of the person's choice and is the
9	surviving spouse or child of any of the following who were killed in the course and scope of employment:
10	(a) a paid or volunteer member of a municipal or rural fire department;
11	(b) a law enforcement officer as defined in 7-32-201; or
12	(c) a full-time highway patrol officer."
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14	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.

STATE OF MONTANA - FISCAL NOTE

Fiscal Note for <u>SB0010</u>, as introduced

<u>DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION</u>: An act authorizing the Board of Regents of Higher Education to waive tuition and fees for the spouse or children of a Montana National Guard member who was killed in action or died as a result of injury, disease, or other disability incurred while serving on state active duty.

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Historically, no Montana National Guard member has been killed in action or died as a result of injury, disease, or other disability incurred while serving on state active duty.
- 2. The cost of fee waivers are approximately \$1,863 for academic year 1997, which covers tuition and fees for one student.
