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11	Section 1. Section 20-26-1503, MCA, is amended to read:
12	"20-26-1503. Use of rural physician incentive trust fund. (1) The rural physician incentive trust
13	fund is statutorily appropriated, as provided in 17-7-502, to the board of regents of higher education to be
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16	state that demonstrate a need for assistance in physician recruitment; and
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18	administering the program may not exceed 10% of the annual fees assessed pursuant to 20-26-1502.
19	(2) The board of regents shall establish procedures for determining the areas of the state that
20	qualify for assistance in physician recruitment. An eligible area must demonstrate that a physician shortage
21	exists or that the area has been unsuccessful in recruiting physicians by other mechanisms.

<u>DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION</u>:

An act increasing the maximum amount of an educational debt payment that a rural physician may receive from the Board of Regents and amending section 20-26-1503, MCA

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The current tuition surcharge will be sufficient to cover the costs of the proposed increase in the program.
- 2. The current revenues from the tuition surcharge are expected to be \$191,000 in fiscal 1998 and \$194,000 in fiscal 1999.
- 3. The average amount paid to physicians over the last three years is \$68,000.
- 4. The annual payment structure to rural physicians qualifying for this program will increase as follows:

- 5. Physicians remain in this program for varying amounts of time. It is assumed that 60% of the physicians remain in the program for the full five years and would receive the full 50% increase. The remaining 40% would receive an average of a 15% increase.
- 6. An increase of 40% is projected in participation in the program.
- 7. The total projected cost increase is 76% over the current expenditures of \$68,000 $(.60 \times .50 + .15 \times .40 + .40) = .76$. For a total projected cost of \$119,680 per year.
