

A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT ENHANCING THE PUBLIC SAFETY ON MONTANA HIGHWAYS BY REVISING THE LAWS PERTAINING TO VIOLATIONS OF SPEED RESTRICTIONS; IMPOSING SPECIAL SPEED LIMITATIONS ON ALL VEHICLES EXCEEDING 10,000 POUNDS; AMENDING SECTIONS 7-14-2113, 61-8-303, AND 61-8-312. MCA; REPEALING SECTIONS 61-8-304, 61-8-305, 61-8-306, 61-8-307, 61-8-718, AND 61-11-103, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

Section 1. Section 7-14-2113, MCA, is amended to read:
"7-14-2113. County authority to establish speed limits. A board of county commissioners may, by ordinance, establish a special speed limit in accordance with 61-8-306 61-8-310 on any county road."

Section 2. Section 61-8-303, MCA, is amended to read:
"61-8-303. Speed restrictions -- basic rule. (1) A person operating or driving a vehicle of any character on a public highway of this state shall drive the vehicle in a careful and prudent manner and at a rate of speed no greater than is reasonable and proper under the conditions existing at the point of operation, taking intocent. A person violates this section if the person fails to:
(a) reduce the speed of the vehicle to account for one or more of the following conditions:
(i) the amount and character of traffic $\overline{-i}_{-}$
(ii) the condition of the brakes $\bar{i}_{i}$
(iii) the weight of the vehicle $\bar{i}_{i}$
(iv) the grade and width of the highwavi;
(v) the condition of the surface $e_{i-}$ and
(vi) freedom of obstruction to the view ahead; or
(b) drive at an appropriate reduced speed when:
(i) approaching and crossing an intersection or railway grade crossing;
(ii) approaching and going around a curve;
(iii) approaching a hill crest;
(iv) traveling upon a narrow or winding roadway; or
(v) a special hazard exists involving pedestrians or other traffic or because of weather or highway
condition. The porson operating or driving the vehicte shall drive the vehiele-so as net urfery of unreasonably endangef the-life, -limb, property, of other rights of a person-entith the use of the street or highway.
(2) When a special hazard exists does not exist that requires lower speed for compliance with subsection (1), the speed of a vehicle not in excess of the limits specified in this section or established as authorized in 61-8-309 through 61-8-311 and 61-8-313 is lawful, but a speed in excess of the following limits is unlawful:
(a) 25 miles an hour in an urban district;
(b) 35 miles an hour on a highway under construction or repair or on a highway being surveyed, unless the department establishes and posts a different limit because of traffic conditions or the condition of the construction, repair, or survey project;
(c) 55 miles an hour in other locations during the nighttime, except that the nighttime speed limit on completed sections of interstate highways is 65 miles an hour.
(3) "Daytime" means from one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset. "Nighttime" means at any other hour.
(4) The speed limits set forth in this section may be altered by the transportation commission or a local authority as authorized in 61-8-309, 61-8-310, and 61-8-313.
(5) The driver of a vohiele-shall, oencietent with subseotion (1), drive at an appropriateredueod speed when approaching and orossing an in or railway grade erossing, when approaehing and geing around auve, when appreaching a hill-erest, when traveling upen a-naffow-or wifiding readway, and when a-spocial hazard-oxists with-respeet-to pedestrians of other traffio or by roason-of weathor of highway eondition."

Section 3. Section 61-8-312, MCA, is amended to read:
"61-8-312. Special speed limitations on trteks, trtek-traeters, vehicles exceeding 10,000 pounds and motor-driven cycles, and vehiolec-towing housetraiters. (1) A person may not operate a truok of truek
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vehicle, the gross vehicle weight or rating of which exceeds $8,00010,000$ pounds, at a speed greater than 65 miles per an hour on those completed sections of interstate and four lanedivided highays and 60 miles an hour on primary and secondary highways. However, the twek nighttime speed limit of a vehicle exceeding 10,000 pounds may not exceed that of automobiles, as stated in 61-8-303.
(2) A person may not operate a vehicle subject to a term permit under 61-10-124(3)(d) or a truck-trailer-trailer or truck tractor-semitrailer-trailer-trailer combination of vehicles subject to special permits under 61-10-124(6) at a speed greater than 55 miles an hour.
(3) A person may not operate a motor-driven cycle at any time mentioned in 61-9-201 at a speed greater than 35 miles an hour unless the motor-driven cycle is equipped with a headlamp or lamps that are adequate to reveal a person or vehicle at a distance of 300 feet ahead.

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Fiscal Note for SB0360, as introduced
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DESCRIPTION OF PROPOSED LEGISLATION:
An act enhancing the public safety on Montana highways by revising the laws pertaining to violations of speed restrictions; imposing special speed limitations on all vehicles exceeding 10,000 pounds.

ASSUMPTIONS:

1. Highway Patrol officers would continue to issue citations for violation of this section of law at the same rate $(6,825$ in 1996).
2. The conviction rate for issued citations would increase based on clarification of elements within the statute.
3. Highway patrol officers would see a slight reduction in case preparation time and court time leading to increased efficiency and time savings.

## FISCAL IMPACT:

The fiscal impact to the state would be minimal.
