INTRODUCED BY Cole Justine 1 2 A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF MONTANA REQUESTING THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS TO PROPOSE AN AMENDMENT TO THE 5 UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION TO CLARIFY THAT FEDERAL COURTS CANNOT REQUIRE A STATE OR 6 7 POLITICAL SUBDIVISION OF A STATE TO LEVY OR INCREASE A TAX; ENCOURAGING OTHER STATES TO SUPPORT THE SAME AMENDMENT TO THE UNITED STATES CONSTITUTION; AND REQUIRING THE 8 SECRETARY OF STATE TO SEND A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO CERTAIN PERSONS. 9 10 WHEREAS, separation of powers is fundamental to the United States Constitution, and the power 11 12 of the federal government is strictly limited; and 13 WHEREAS, under the United States Constitution, the states are to determine public policy; and WHEREAS, it is the duty of the judiciary to interpret the law, not to create law; and 14 15 WHEREAS, our present federal government has strayed from the intent of our founding fathers and the United States Constitution through inappropriate federal mandates; and 16 WHEREAS, these mandates by way of statute, rule, or judicial decision have forced state 17 18 governments to serve as the mere administrative arm of the federal government; and 19 WHEREAS, federal District Courts, with the acquiescence of the United States Supreme Court, 20 continue to order states to levy or increase taxes to comply with federal mandates; and WHEREAS, these court actions violate the United States Constitution and the legislative process; 21 22 and 23 WHEREAS, the time has come for the people of this great nation and their duly elected 24 representatives in state government to reaffirm, in no uncertain terms, that the authority to tax under the 25 United States Constitution is retained by the people who, by their consent alone, delegate the power to tax 26 explicitly to their duly elected representatives in the Legislative Branch of government who are directly 27 responsible and accountable to the people who have elected them; and WHEREAS, several states have petitioned the United States Congress to propose an amendment 28 29 to the United States Constitution to prevent federal courts from levying or increasing taxes without



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representation of the people and against the people's wishes, and the amendment has been introduced.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF T	Ή
STATE OF MONTANA:	

- (1) That the United States Congress prepare and submit to the several states an amendment to the United States Constitution to add a new article that reads: "Neither the Supreme Court nor any inferior court of the United States shall have the power to instruct or order a state or a political subdivision of a state or an official of a state or political subdivision of a state to levy or increase a tax."
- (2) That this application constitutes a continuing application in accordance with Article V of the United States Constitution.
- (3) That the Senate and the House of Representatives of the State of Montana also propose that the Legislatures of each of the several states composing the United States that have not yet made a similar request apply to the United States Congress requesting enactment of an appropriate amendment congruent with the language proposed in subsection (1).
- (4) That the Secretary of State transmit a copy of this joint resolution to the President and Vice President of the United States, the presiding officer in each house of the Legislature in each state of the United States, the Speaker of the United States House of Representatives, the Majority Leader of the United States Senate, and to each member of Montana's Congressional Delegation.

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
