

PREFACE

When the new constitution for the state of Montana was published after its ratification in 1972, it included an index compiled by the Allen Smith Company, publisher, which referenced topics to the article and section numbers. The index for the proceedings is based upon that constitution index, with additional and expanded headings to cover operation and proceedings of the convention, the biographies and committee assignments of delegates, and a broader topic index.

Action on the Style and Drafting Committee proposals, final consideration, and adoption are not included in the individual designations in most cases (except for the individual articles). Discussion at these stages covered an entire article or section by number, rather than referring to topics within the article or section. In cases where amendments were made, a reference is included.

Volumes I and II, containing delegate and committee proposals and information about the delegates and the operation of the convention, were prepared by the Legal Services Division of the Legislative Council and printed in typewritten form. Later the transcript of the proceedings was compiled and edited by the Legislative Council and typeset by Color World of Bozeman, Montana, with the transcript beginning with page 1. Because pages 1 through 1113 appear in both the preliminary Volumes I and II and the transcript, Volumes III through VII, the index identifies pages as Vol. I, pages 1 through 544; Vol. II, pages 545 through 1113; or Trans. (for Transcript), pages 1 through 3047. Numbers of the transcript pages in each volume are listed on the volume spine.

Article and section numbers cited within the transcript are the numbers which appear in the committee proposals and are not always in agreement with the numbers as they finally appear in the adopted constitution. When referred to in the index, the adopted constitution number is used.

I wish to thank Diana Dowling, Executive Director of the Legislative Council, and the members of the Constitutional Convention Publishing Committee for their patience when progress of the index was slow indeed; Jacqueline Terrell, Legislative Council Code Indexer, for advice and encouragement; Valeri Hanson, of the Legislative Council Staff, for setting up the format and typing the copy for printing; and Phyllis Cote and Marie Fuhrmann, Legislative Council Proofreaders, for proofreading.
