## Pretrial Diversion Performance Measurement Overview Lewis and Clark County January 1, 2019, to December 31, 2024

- Maximize public safety by reserving detention for those offenders who pose the greatest risk to reoffend or fail to appear in court.
- Maximize court appearance.
- Maximize the appropriate use of release and detention by use of services designed to fulfill the two goals stated above.

Data is collected using the AutoMon case management system. The data still contains "noise" and will continue to need refinement. ( <i>Please note that percentages were rounded and may not add to 100%</i> )
The attached report captured all cases closed <u>Lewis and Clark County</u> between January 1, 2019, and December 31, 2024. During that time-period, 4779 or 88% of the Public Safety Assessment-related cases were closed. (PMR report – 2 as a percentage of 1)
About 67% or 3217 defendants were released pre-trial from detention. (3 as a percentage of 2) Of those, about 77% were released on their own recognizance. (6 as a percentage of 3) The other 23% had some form of cash bail required for release.
Of the defendants not released pre-trial, 25% were a level 1 on the PSA, 47% were a level 2, and 28% were a level 3. (15, 16, 17 as a percentage of 11)
For defendants released pre-trial, 89% reported to their court appearances. (**Please note this reflects cases in which a warrant was issued for the failure to appear. If a defendant did not appear but a warrant was not issued, it is not counted as it doesn't exist in the database.) (18 as a percentage of 3)
In the closed cases, 79% of the defendants remained law-abiding. (19 as a percentage of 3) 352 people were arrested for new misdemeanors and 311 for new felonies. 176 of these were violent offenses.
The OCA does not maintain or collect county jail data. Thus, it is difficult to assess the impact on overall jail populations, which include not only pre-trial defendants, but people convicted who are awaiting a Department of Corrections placement, serving a misdemeanor sentencing, or awaiting the outcome of a probation violation. Several detention facilities also house federal inmates.
