




* Case Clearance Rates increased by 18% between Q1 2024 and Q2 2024.


2nd Quarter 2024 Highlights

- * Median Days from Notice of Appeal to Court in Domestic Relations and Abuse & Neglect saw a reduction between Q1 2024 and Q2 2024.
- * Time to Disposition rates increased between Q1 2024 and Q2 2024

Direct Appeal Lifecycle - Median Days by Case Type

- Median Days from Notice of Appeal to Court
- Median Days from Date Sent to Court to Classification
- Median Days from Classification to Remittitur





Case Clearance: The ratio between the number of cases closed (outgoing) and the number of cases filed (incoming). Manner of Disposition: The manner by which the Court disposes of its cases.

Age of Pending Cases: The age of the Court's active cases (does not include stayed cases).

Time to Disposition: The length of time (median days) it takes the Court to dispose of cases.
