Please Note: These are summary minutes. Testimony and discussion are paraphrased and condensed.

CULTURAL AND AESTHETICS GRANT PROGRAM

Tape 1:A:000

Issues Discussion:

David Nelson, Montana Arts Council, (MAC), referred to issues facing the committee and the council, and asked for the leadership of the Legislature in addressing those issues. He countered some of the allegations made by Mr. Giebel the day previous, and presented the committee with the letters to and from the council as an indication of the responsiveness of MAC. In response to Mr. Giebel's comment that his application had not received a good review, Mr. Nelson said before the group meets, each member receives and reviews all of the applications, which they rank. Mr. Giebel's application was unique in that it was ranked at the bottom by all members, and was thus reviewed last during the committee's review of the applications.

Mr. Nelson said Mr. Giebel's application was not considered a small community grant, and cited the status of Mr. Giebel's organization as a California non-profit organization. He said

the committee only worked with what it could see, while the Long Range Planning Committee heard more from applicants.

Mr. Nelson distributed a schematic diagram of the cultural infrastructure, the role of the Montana Arts Council and its delivery system of support and funding to groups throughout the state. **EXHIBIT 1** He went on to address issues facing the organization. One is the perception that MAC is competing with the people they serve. This has been going on for ten years with the funding of the Oral History Program and the Folklife Program from the C&A Grant fund. He asked the subcommittee's help in settling this issue by having these critical core programs funded out of General Fund monies.

Mr. Nelson then addressed the issue of the recent change of direction in the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA), redirecting substantial monies towards rural arts delivery. **EXHIBIT 2** The new money (\$1,071,000 and \$6,200,000) is available for state arts agencies, but Montana will not be able to compete due to the lack of state match. He mentioned the competition: Wyoming, with \$450,000 General Fund money; Idaho, with \$650,000; and Montana, with \$135,000 General Fund money for match. A possible solution would be authorizing the use of returned funds from awarded grants over the interim to apply for matching rural grants.

Regarding the issue of who gets help and who doesn't, he handed out and reviewed a list covering the Distribution of Grants and Services by the Montana Arts Council. **EXHIBITS 3 & 4** In addition to the debate about rural issues, there are other debates. In feedback from organizations around the state, one complaint is major institutions are not getting their full share of the money. They feel the money is being wasted on small projects. Artists say not enough is being done for the artist and the statewide organizations feel there is not enough being done for them. Nevertheless, there is much success using these monies and a tremendous corps of volunteers. He expressed concern that the bigger picture could be lost, and asked the subcommittee's support and time to settle these issues.

SEN. LYNCH, in reviewing the exhibits, commented that Butte/Anaconda would do a lot better in the grant process if it had more members on the Citizens Advisory Committee. **Mr. Nelson** said there was representation from Butte on the Montana Arts Council. In addition, the make up of the committee could be changed in any way and the tendency would still be as it is all across the country: a) university towns, as exporters of services, get more money; and b) urban areas get more money for a wealth of reasons. However, MAC has always funded groups for outreach as in the example of the Missoula Children's Theater. He addressed the issue of expertise on the Citizens Committee and the need for Montana people who are familiar with Montana's unique situations on this panel.

REP. BARDANOUE asked how much federal money would potentially be available to Montana. Mr. Nelson said \$6,200,000 would be available nationally, with the possibility of \$190,000 coming to Montana. The agency would budget amend in \$90,000, the amount not requiring a match. All the rest would require a match. REP. BARDANOUE asked if left over monies could be used for match. Mr. Nelson said yes, and that \$1 in General Fund dollars could leverage between \$2.60 and \$3.30 in federal dollars for rural programs. He requested talking about having access to reverted funds first before removing money from the grant program.

REP. THOFT asked the difference between the money available this biennium for grants and the money granted. Mr. Haubein directed the committee to the cash flow sheet indicating a balance of \$74,146. EXHIBIT 5 REP. BARDANOUE asked for an estimate of the reversions. Carleen Layne said the amounts that revert fluctuates. The maximum projected is \$190,000, primarily from challenge grants. REP. BARDANOUE asked how much they estimated they would need for match the potential federal dollars. Mr. Nelson said \$150,000 over the two year period could be doubled.

REP. THOFT said the \$75,000 balance plus the reversions would approximate that figure (\$150,000). Mr. Haubein said the \$74,000 figure did not assume reversions and was thus a very conservative estimate. Ms. Hamman asked if the \$150,000 was an amount over and above grant 361, the Montana Arts Council grant application for Rural Arts Organizational Development and Artists in the Schools Program for \$35,000. Mr. Nelson suggested including that in the total, bringing the amount needed down to \$115,000. Ms. Hamman said the Executive recommended \$70,000 for this matching, with the Advisory Committee cutting that to \$35,000, and now the number is \$150,000. The Executive was not aware of the potential for matching at the time of setting the budget.

REP. THOFT said he supported the work of the Citizens Committee, and had three issues he would like to discuss with the subcommittee. Other than that, he was not inclined to go through each grant application. SEN. LYNCH said he had a couple of grant applications he wished to discuss. SEN. HOCKETT asked about the \$35,000 match recommended in grant 361, and what would happen to it. Mr. Nelson said MAC had its own granting program, through which this money would be used to strengthen rural arts programs and Artists in the Schools residencies. The other money would be used to compete nationally for the rural money in the form of grants. Fort Peck would be the model to follow in the use of this money to stabilize rural arts institutions.

REP. BARDANOUE expressed his unhappiness with well established organizations receiving money for endowments to build up cash reserves while many programs are barely surviving. He suggested that well-established organizations have resources and a large community behind them.

Mr. Nelson agreed that the money for endowments is being cut back and is much more competitive. He gave examples where it has worked wonderfully, and said he did not want it totally cut out. He added that those are one-time grants. REP. BARDANOUE said he would rather cut some of that out and put it in the reserve to match federal dollars. REP. THOFT said building endowments would eventually release more money for the smaller organizations.

Mr. Nelson referred the committee to the Issues Section of the book, page 9, which addresses this Challenge Grant issue.

Regarding the process for Executive Action, SEN. HARDING said that generally, those projects not recommended by the Citizens Advisory Committee might not be capable of utilizing the money to remain solvent. In almost every case, she felt they must take the recommendation of the committee.

REP. THOFT said the three applications he wished to address were: Lewistown, who deserved some funding; Ravalli County TV, who needed all they requested or nothing at all; and the Daly Mansion, the removal of the contingency regarding the use of the funds for the director's salary.

A discussion followed on whether or not the committee would act as a rubber stamp, and the rationale behind the time spent reviewing the applications. Mr. Nelson said he had concerns about the process as well. He suggested designing a program that could lump infrastructure types of grants as one report from the Citizens Committee. In addition, those flagship organizations that are funded over and over at the same level could be grouped. It would continue to be important to hear the new and emerging groups, people and issues, such as that presented by Mr. Giebel. The process could be streamlined without losing valuable legislative oversight.

Additional issues the subcommittee wanted to review individually during Executive Action are: possible duplication in MQTV's grant application, 372, for development of a videotape catalogue, and Montana Tape Exchange Network, 468; State support for three ballet companies; support for the group from Terry requesting money for the Prairie County Museum, support for the Biddle Community Heritage Center, and the possible partial funding of the Fort Benton application, "Visions from the Land". Mr. Pratt discussed the differences between the two videotape related projects, and offered to discuss that issue with the two applicants. Mr. Nelson addressed the issue of the ballet companies, quoting the adage that you fund an organization enough that it has a chance of success. Out of this process, one strong company may emerge, perhaps incorporating the others.

SEN. HOCKETT asked if the purchase of the land around the Daly Mansion, brought up by the Daly Mansion Preservation Trust representatives, would later be brought before the committee.

REP. THOFT said he did not know. SEN. HOCKETT said 500 acres adjacent to the mansion were on the market for \$1,200,000. REP. THOFT said the carriage house and the lake would be worth acquiring but not the 500 acres.

SEN. HOCKETT asked about the funding of the core programs, Folklife and Oral History. Mr. Nelson suggested that minimally the salaries for the positions should be funded, and considered each biennium as current level, thus enabling the agencies to look for grants and remove them from the competitive grant process. For that, an additional \$4,480 would be needed for Folklife, and \$7,976 for Oral History above and beyond the \$50,000 recommended for each program. Mr. Nelson spoke in support of these core programs, a term he defined as a program that exists in every state in the nation, part of an established system. Regarding the impact on the ending fund balance that would result, Mr. Nelson said the decrease of approximately \$12,000 would at least end the issue, with the subcommittee regarding them in the future as a current level request.

SEN. HOCKETT asked if individual oral history projects would be coordinated within the Oral History Program. Mr. Nelson said that potential duplication and requests to coordinate are included in the Citizens Committee review. In addition, the Oral History Program is not able to do all of the oral history in the state. They act as coordinator, trainer, and funder in small amounts.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON CULTURAL AND AESTHETICS GRANTS

Tape No. 1:B:950

Motion: SEN. HARDING moved to transfer \$5,000 forfeited from Bitterroot Valley Public TV, Project 416, to the Montana Puppet Guild, Project 450, for the Blanche Harding Puppet project.

Discussion: SEN. HARDING said their request was \$4,997 more than was recommended. REP. THOFT asked what would be done with the additional money. SEN. HARDING said they could not complete the project, and there was urgency in view of Ms. Harding's advancing age. SEN. LYNCH said he saw more compelling needs, and REP. THOFT suggested putting it on the list with the other projects the committee wished to reconsider.

SEN. HARDING withdrew her motion.

Motion/Vote: REP. THOFT moved to cut \$5,000 recommended for Bitterroot Valley Public TV, Project 416. They had indicated they needed the \$15,000 to do the project, and would either accept that amount or \$0. Motion CARRIED unanimously.

Motion/Vote: REP. THOFT moved to remove a contingency on Project 399, Daly Mansion Preservation Trust. This would enable them to use the money towards a director's salary. Motion CARRIED unanimously.

REP. BARDANOUVE suggested the committee remove \$25,000 from the endowment grants and use that money towards leveraging federal dollars, some of which have a 3:1 match. That could amount to \$75,000 in the future. SEN. LYNCH said that was not necessary since there was to be \$35,000 set aside for federal match. There also was the possibility of reversions up to as much as \$175,000. Assuming a state "fund" of \$115,000, and the probable maximum available to Montana of \$150,000, no more money would be needed. REP. THOFT commented that there was also an ending fund balance of \$75,000 that could go into that pot. Mr. Nelson clarified state dollars could be matched 2:1 on the outside, 1:1 for sure. He added the maximum federal dollar amount that could be matched was \$190,000, but based on the committee's discussions, he felt that the \$115,000 would be adequate. He also suggested that the endowment trimming could be used to deal with the other issues before the committee.

Motion: SEN. LYNCH moved to fund Lewistown Art Center with \$1500 for a match for a SOS Assistance Grant and an Artists' Residency Program.

Discussion: Mr. Nelson commented these two programs were already in existence, and would help Lewistown. The SOS program provides an organization with a complete analysis to determine if the organization should continue. SEN. HOCKETT spoke in support of the motion.

Vote: Motion CARRIED unanimously.

Motion/Vote: SEN. LYNCH moved to fund the Museum of the Northern Great Plains, Project 488, for \$10,000 in order to complete one video. Motion CARRIED unanimously.

Motion/Vote: SEN. HARDING moved to give an additional \$2,000 to the Prairie County Museum, Project 413 for a total grant award of \$3,000. Motion CARRIED unanimously.

Motion/Vote: REP. THOFT moved to increase funds in the amount of \$1,500 for the Milwaukee Rode Cultural Project, Project 364, for a total of \$4,000. Motion CARRIED, with REP. BARDANOUVE voting no.

Tape 2:A:020

Motion: SEN. HARDING moved to fund the Montana Puppet Guild with an additional \$2,000, for a total amount of \$4,000.

Discussion: SEN. LYNCH commented that it was his understanding that this would be used to document her personal and professional life and her artistry, but could not be used to pay for production of "Lewis and Clark's Adventures". He asked what the additional money would be used for. SEN. HARDING said it would be for documenting her life as a puppeteer, and keeping the puppet stage alive by demonstrating the construction of puppets. SEN. LYNCH said that with the contingency, there was not much more they could do with additional money. Ms. Layne clarified that \$6,200 was proposed for post-production work on 3 videos on Lewis and Clark, so the contingency would have to be changed. She added that they could use \$4,937 on the remainder of their project.

Vote: Motion CARRIED 4 to 2 on a Roll Call Vote.

HEARING ON GARNET PRESERVATION ASSOCIATION

220

Informational Testimony:

CHAIR CONNELLY introduced Dwight Gappert, representing the Garnet Preservation Association, GPA, who had asked for additional time before the committee. He said they had applied for two grants, numbers 395 and 397, to which the Citizens Advisory Committee had commented that their board was weak. Mr. Gappert said he agreed, and that the board had met during the week on the issue. The one project which had been approved for funding, 397, the restoration project, was contingent upon a 3:1 match with the BLM. Since they were not guaranteed of getting that money, it was possible that they could go through this biennium without any grant. The biggest problem they were facing was the weakness of their board and the need of a new director. He asked the committee to consider funding the directorship.

Questions from Subcommittee Members:

SEN. LYNCH asked if the \$17,000 they had requested was just to pay the director. Mr. Gappert said that was a matching grant for a two year period, with a \$6,000 amount to be provided by GPA. The director would apply for grants, set up and organize fund raisers, comply with requirements required by the federal government (BLM), coordinate with the University on archeological diggings, and meet any requirements of the Historical Society (Garnet is nominated for the National Register of Historic Places). In addition, this person would coordinate the private mining groups, the federal government, and the GPA on road and usage agreements.

SEN. HOCKETT asked how GPA would work with BLM. Mr. Gappert said that BLM provided the majority of its support of in-kind services (dirt work, road construction) to support the volume of visitor traffic, but not cash except in the form of grants. A director

would enhance BLM's involvement by working higher up on BLM's chain of command.

HEARING ON ORAL HISTORY PROGRAM

500

Informational Testimony:

Larry Sommer, Montana Historical Society, requested time to address the committee on the budget of the Oral History Program, a request of Sen. Hockett. He referred to a letter sent to the committee and information on the program. EXHIBIT 6 & 7 The nature of the Oral History Program was outreach, with the majority of the Oral Historian's time spent around the state conducting interviews and working with groups in a consulting and coordinating capacity. Regarding their budget and request, he reiterated that \$50,000 was not enough, and might prevent the Society from continuing the program. That amount did not cover the salary, let alone the operating costs which are directly related to the travel and work outside of Helena.

Questions from Subcommittee Members:

SEN. LYNCH asked about the source of the many letters in support of the program that the committee received. There was a discussion about the ineffectiveness of this approach to lobbying, especially because of the numbers and "form letter" quality of the letters. REP. THOFT asked who made the decision to cut their request from \$73,400 to \$50,000. Mr. Nelson said that was the decision of the Citizens Advisory Committee. The original cut occurred last session, when they were cut by \$10,000. At one time, the budget award from the C & A Grant Program had been as high as \$94,000.

Dick King, Chair, Citizens Advisory Committee, introduced committee members, Marilyn Wessel, Bozeman; Judy Erickson, Great Falls; and Elaine Howard, Butte. He spoke of the difficulty of funding core programs, Oral History and Folklife, through the C & A Grant Program. They had to rank these programs as a competitive application with other much smaller grants requests. The recommendation for the Historical Society was reasonable, based upon the record number of applications (129), a record amount of funds requested, and close to the same amount of money available as in the previous biennium. Mr. King said these two programs were originally funded through the Cultural Trust, beginning with the Capitol Murals. The issue he wished to leave with the subcommittee was whether or not to continue this method of funding.

Mr. Nelson said the recommendation of the Arts Council was to take the funding for these two programs off the top and view it as current level expenses from this time forward. The Folklife Project could live with the basic salary, which would be \$56,000, but Oral History needed more.

REP. BARDANOUVE commented on the amount of the recommended grant awards, and said he would support the Citizens Committee recommendations. SEN. LYNCH said he did not think the subcommittee had that option, and that there was one FTE without basic salary funding. To avoid cutting his salary, money would have to come from General Fund, or there would not be a program. REP. THOFT said the subcommittee had two options - to fund or delete the position. Mr. Nelson said the issue was for the committee to bite the bullet and grandfather these positions in. Once a project is funded out of a non-General Fund source, it will never get it back into the General Fund.

REP. BARDANOUVE commented that Mr. Nelson was saying that regardless of salaries, this program was above the others. He added the committee didn't judge all the other projects on the basis of salary. Mr. Nelson said these core programs and the other applicants were not the same. Mr. King added that the programs were presented by the Citizens Committee in the pool of other applicants, and not as core programs to be funded at current level, to avoid being accused of favoritism.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON ORAL HISTORY PROGRAM

1121

Motion: REP. THOFT moved to approve the funding of the Oral History Program at the Montana Historical Society, Project 404, at their requested level of \$73,400, with the additional \$23,400 needed coming from the endowment grants.

Discussion: REP. THOFT said he was concerned with leaving match money in the ending fund balance for the match money required for federal money. SEN. HOCKETT said that still left the subcommittee with the dilemma of considering funding the Folklife Program. REP. THOFT said he thought they could get by. Mr. Nelson said the Folklorist would write grants to cover the deficit in that program, and that the critical issue was a recommendation that these two projects could come into this group at current level. REP. THOFT disagreed, and said they should have to apply.

Vote: Motion CARRIED, REP. BARDANOUVE voting no.

Motion/Vote: SEN. HOCKETT moved to subtract a percentage of each of the 11 Challenge Grant awards on a pro-rata basis to cover the additional \$23,400. Motion CARRIED unanimously.

Motion/Vote: REP. BARDANOUVE moved to approve all of the recommended grant awards as amended by the preceding Executive Action. Motion CARRIED unanimously.

2:B:000

REP. BARDANOUVE said a motion was needed to appropriate the unused balance and reversions to the Montana Arts Council for the purpose of seeking and matching federal dollars. Mr. Haubein said he would prepare that amendment which could be worked into a section of the bill referring to money for the evaluations.

CHAIR CONNELLY said there were some amendments to consider: the change in date for grant submission from September 1 to August 1 and the amendment on the local government support requirement.

EXHIBIT 8 REP. BARDANOUVE said these amendments constituted substantive change in the law, and could not be done in an appropriation bill. A discussion followed as to whether or not these were substantive changes. **Mr. Nelson** commented that changes such as these had always taken place in this bill, since all of the rules and regulations were in this appropriation bill. **Ms. Layne** said the appropriation section had never been put into statute, but the rest of the language is included in the codes.

Mr. Haubein said he would contact the Legislative Council on this issue. Approval on the amendments was held until the following day.

EXECUTIVE ACTION ON GARNET PRESERVATION ASSOCIATION

SEN. HOCKETT asked the Citizens Advisory Committee members to comment on Garnet's request. **Mr. King** said the staff had concern about the integrity of the organization. They grappled with the issue of how best to help an organization faced with the hurdle of becoming more effective. Obviously, a paid staff, rather than volunteer staff, would enhance their capability to become solid. He stood by the committee recommendation, and pointed out the receipt by the organization of substantial funding in the past (\$45,000 for operational support). The committee felt that was enough money and that the organization should have more to show for it. The Citizens Advisory Committee was saying that the organization should try to get some help and come back in two years.

SEN. HARDING commented the Montana Arts Council has said their purpose was to help these organizations become more effective. She wondered if the GPA would utilize MAC for the help suggested. **Mr. Pratt** suggested switching \$5,000 from the Capital Expenditure Project to the other application if that was amenable to them. **Mr. Gappert** said it would be, and commented that it had been his understanding the application for the director's grant was their way of getting the help suggested by the committee.

Motion: **SEN. HARDING** moved to transfer \$5,000 from Project 397, Restoration of Kelley Saloon and Hannifen House, to Project 395, Director funding.

Motion/Vote: **REP. BARDANOUVE** moved to approve an amendment to give the Garnet Preservation Association the option to make the switch at their discretion; i.e., to use the \$5,000 on either project or both at their own discretion. Motion on the amendment **CARRIED** unanimously.

Vote: The motion on the amended motion **CARRIED** unanimously.

Mr. King spoke in favor of the amendments before the subcommittee: one, the application deadline; the other, removing the requirement that a non-profit organization that owns a cultural facility must receive local government support. He mentioned the committee's denial of Archie Bray's applications, as well as the applications of the Helena Arts Council, on that technicality. Regarding equity with rural arts organizations, and the testimony process, Mr. King offered his personal comment that applicants from rural communities, often volunteers, appreciate the opportunity to participate in the legislative process. He offered the Citizens Advisory Committee's meeting in May as a forum to address the issues of access by rural arts organizations and streamlining of the process.

Letters in support of the Holter Museum of Art's grant applications 428 and 429 were entered into the record, one from Joan Holter, member, Board of Trustees, and Jean Baucus.



RE: NEA MEMO RE FY 1991 APPROPRIATIONS AND REAUTHORIZATION

Some very important information arrived today dated November 23, 1990, from NEA States Program Director, Edward Dickey.

The following is of the utmost importance to the Council in its planning:

"On October 27th the Congress completed action on a bill reauthorizing the Arts Endowment for three years and appropriating \$174.083 for FY 91. The purpose of this memo is to provide information about the impact of the legislation on funding to state arts agencies and regional organizations.

The legislation increases funds set aside for distribution to state and regional arts agencies from 20 percent to 25 percent of program funds. The increase takes effect in FY 91, with the set-aside remaining at 25 percent in FY 92 and increasing to 27.5 percent in FY 93.

Using the enclosed form, state arts agencies should prepare a revised budget based on the increased allocations. Revised budgets should be mailed to the Endowment by February 15, 1991 along with a description of your agency's plans for using its additional \$90,000. In planning for the use of the additional funds, *the Endowment encourages agencies to consider national priorities, including: Arts Education; Rural Arts Delivery; Cultural Diversity; and Assistance to Arts Institutions. This is not a requirement but is strongly urged.*

Collaborative Initiatives:

Under the existing States Program Guidelines, *\$1,071 million is available from the 25 percent set aside for encouragement of collaborative efforts between the states and regions and Endowment discipline programs.* Now that the budgets of the discipline programs are being reduced substantially in order to accommodate the increased set-aside for the states, collaborative initiative dollars are especially needed to encourage and enable programs to continue their commitments to partnership. In FY 91 we anticipate that collaborative initiative dollars may be used to support not more than half of the costs of grants to state and regional agencies under Dance on Tour, the Regional Visual Arts Fellowship Program, and Design Grants to State Arts Agencies and Regional Organizations.

5% Set-Aside for Developing Arts Organizations and Underserved Areas:

The legislation sets aside another *5 percent of the Endowment's FY 91 program funds (approximately \$6.2 million) for competitive grants to state arts agencies and consortia of state arts agencies for projects that (1) raise the artistic capabilities of developing arts organizations, or (2) stimulate artistic activity and broader public access to the arts in rural, inner city, and other underserved areas.* This set-aside will remain at 5 percent for FY 92 and increase to 7.5 percent for FY 93."

In response to the request of Senator Hockett, I am providing the Committee the following figures breaking the Oral History program proposal down into budget categories. Our request was for \$73,400 for the 92-93 biennium, which amounts to the current level from this biennium, plus the inflation factor allowed under the rules of the Arts Council for Operating Support Grants. The amount recommended by the Advisory Review Committee was \$50,000. Our main concern, as expressed in my testimony, is that this smaller amount would eliminate all funds for travel and other expenses incurred to support the outreach activity of this program, including conducting interviews, workshops for local groups and consultations as well as for transcription and indexing of tapes to provide access to the information collected.

The salary plus benefits for the Oral History program staff, which consists solely of one FTE professional, Mr. John Terreo, would be approximately \$57,956 for the two years, exclusive of any raise that may be awarded in the state pay plan this session. (Under current state procedures governing such a grant attached to a state agency, Mr. Terreo must be treated the same as any state employee.

The total expenses for the program for the biennium are budgeted as follows:

Virtually all of the operating expenses (but especially travel and communications) are directly related to the extensive outreach activities of the office.

No overhead or administrative costs are charged to the C & A projects grant. These costs are absorbed by the Society as an in-kind contribution to the Oral History program.

I hope this summary answers the committee's questions about the project budget. Please feel free to contact me if anyone on the committee has other questions or needs additional information.

Amend 22-2-301. Cultural and aesthetic projects grants. (1) Any person, association, or representative of a governing unit seeking a grant for a cultural or aesthetic project from the income of the trust funds created in 15-35-108 must submit a grant proposal to the cultural and aesthetic projects advisory committee, in care of the Montana ~~historical society~~ arts council, by ~~September~~ August 1 of the year preceding the convening of a regular legislative session.

Amend 22-2-308. Application procedure - grant criteria. (1) As set forth in subsections (1)(a) and (1)(b), certain grants require local financial or in-kind support. The grant application form, which must be prescribed by the Montana arts council, must request specific information about the level of local support for the project. In the following circumstances, local support is required:

- (a) To receive cultural and aesthetic grant funds, county or municipally owned facilities must obtain financial and in-kind support from their respective local governments.
- ~~(b) To receive grant funding for all grants except the first grant from the cultural and aesthetic grant program, private museums, art centers and cultural facilities must obtain county or municipal financial or in-kind support.~~


