HB 208	Driscoll 3/9/93 (Lynch)	An act requiring that deposits by employers to the Montana Self-Insurers Guaranty Fund be in an amount concurred with by the Fund.
HB 259	Schwinden 3/9/93 (Christiaens)	An act clarifying that an employee of a ski area operator is not entitled to workers' compensation if injured at a time when the employee is not working, or when the employee is working but is not acting in the scope of employment.
HB 534	Cocchiarella (3/11/93) (Lynch)	An act clarifying that workers' compensation rates and rating plans must be developed without regard to any deductible paid on medical losses.
HB 621	Elliott (3/18/93) (Lynch)	An act revising the method of recognizing differences in rates of pay with respect to establishing workers' compensation insurance premiums for the construction industry.

HB 445	McCulloch 3/9/93 (Lynch)	An act providing that an individual attending an adult basic education class 20 hours a week or less while laid off is not disqualified from receiving unemployment insurance benefits.
HB 526	Brandewie 3/9/93 (Aklestad)	An act requiring the Department of Social and Rehabilitation Services and the Department of Revenue to provide certain information to the Department of Labor and Industry for the purpose of preventing fraud and abuse in the unemployment and workers' compensation programs.
HB 472	Wallin 3/9/93 (Keating)	An act excluding a retail establishment employee from coverage under the state overtime compensation laws.
HB 287	Wiseman (Keating)	An act generally revising the workers' compensation act and the occupational disease act of Montana. (AMENDED 2/9/93)
HB 617	Grady 3/15/93 -REREF. (Beck)	An act providing that the Department of Corrections and Human Services may obtain Federal certification for specific prison industries programs.
HB 470	Driscoll (Towe)	An act clarifying workers' compensation coverage for independent contractors, sole proprietors, and working members of a partnership when any of these persons are engaged in a construction industry.
HJR 14	Wagner 3/25/93 (Harp)	A joint resolution directing the State Fund and the Department of Labor and Industry to reduce the workers' compensation premiums for yew bark harvesters.
